Our Partnerships



World Land Trust

“The money that is given to the World Land Trust, in my estimation, **has more effect** on the wild world than almost **anything I can think of.**”

By partnering with the World Land Trust, we aim to dramatically reduce the footprint of our staff, and that of each journey we create. The emissions from every trip are calculated and the equivalent is donated to Reserva Ecológica de Guapiaçu (REGUA), an expansive ecological reserve in the Atlantic Forest in Brazil.

A donation was made on September 30, 2023 in the amount of \$5,900, the total commitment to date \$9,448.

Funds were dedicated to the Fundación Guanacas to help protect and restore the remaining cloud forest in Colombia’s Antioquia Region. More specifically, supporting the purchase and protection of land, and the planting of native trees for wildlife and local communities.

REGUA is a conservation initiative dedicated to habitat restoration, reforestation, the reintroduction of native species and strategic research for reintroduction programs.

Reforestation: efforts to reforest degraded areas of the Atlantic Forest help restore habitats for various species, increasing biodiversity.

Species Reintroduction: Efforts to reintroduce locally extinct or severely reduced species help restore ecological balance and genetic diversity.

Habitat Protection: Conserving large tracts of land and creating corridors between forest fragments protects critical habitats for numerous species and allows biodiversity to thrive.



Children Change Colombia

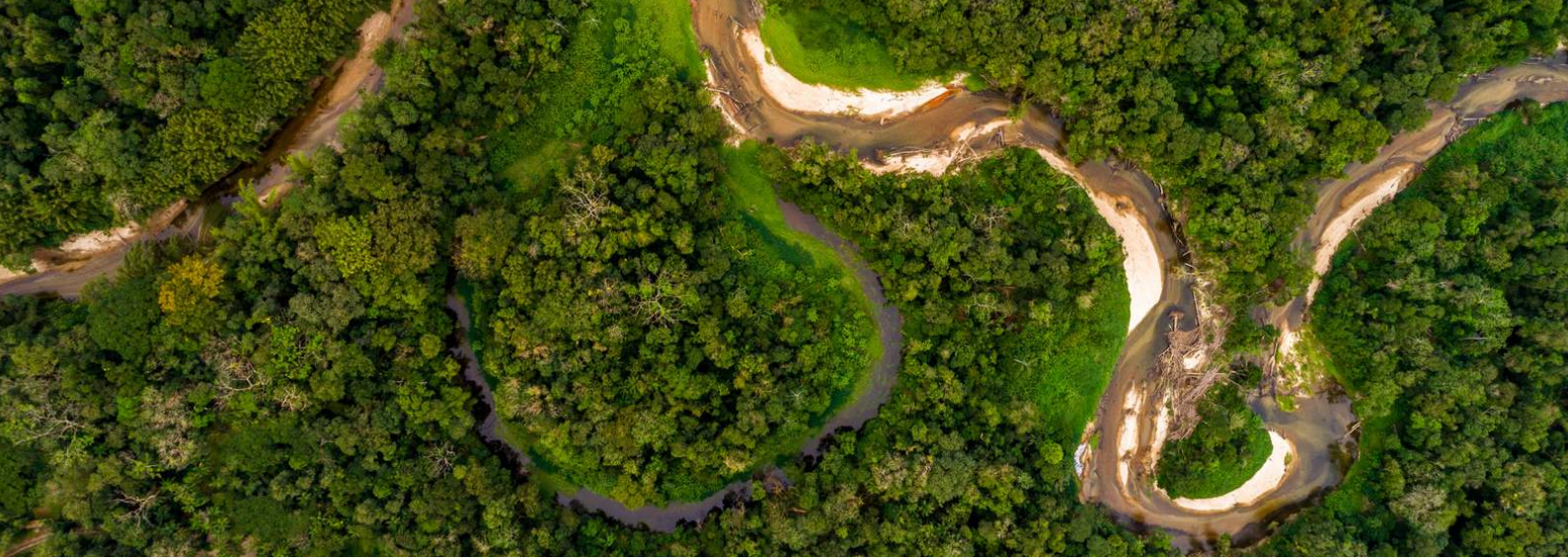
By providing mentoring, psychological support and protection to the children of communities in Colombia's most endangered regions, Children Change aims to secure the safety and wellbeing of those most at risk of being recruited into guerrilla or paramilitary groups, prostitution or illegal mining.

PSA's 2023 donation supported the Football for Peace programme in Chocó for purchasing new sports kits and development of workshops on sports for development in peace-building processes, towards the prevention of forced recruitment for over 350 children in the area.

Our current donation is helping to support the construction of a multipurpose, two-level shelter in Istmina, Chocó. The first level will be a dual space, with a communal kitchen and a community hall to serve as transitional resting place for displaced families and a shared space for collective activities, like training sessions and assemblies. On the second-floor, family bedrooms and communal bathrooms will be permanently available to foster displaced by emergency situations.

Looking Ahead

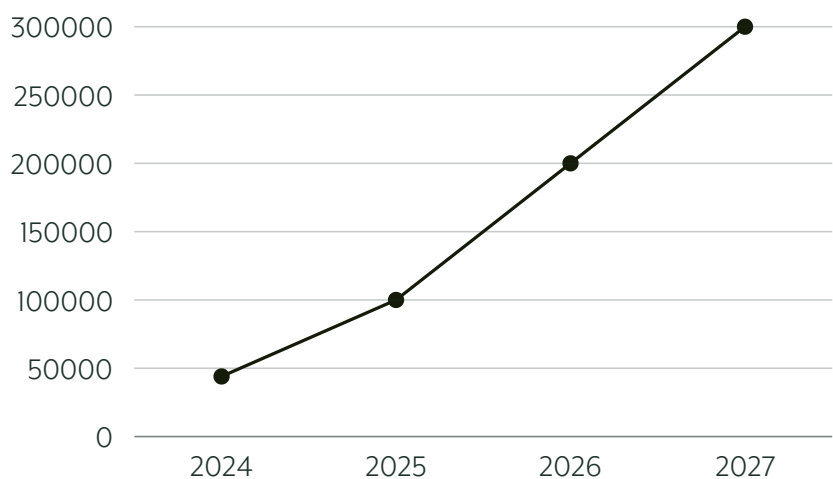
From October 1, 2023 - September 30, 2024, we generated \$44,000 of support, divided equally between our partners, the World Land Trust and Children Change Colombia.
